Dear philanthropists,

e are delighted to release Volume 31 of KEATS Samacharam, our quarterly newsletter — right on schedule. The past quarter has been vibrant, marked by significant progress and encouraging developments.

Our Skill Development Centre (SDC) at Ambarupet is now functioning almost independently, which addresses one of our major concerns — funding such a large initiative. We are pleased to share that the doors to the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) have finally reopened after several months. Based on our commendable track record in training and placements, KEATS has applied under this scheme. The application is currently under review, and the mandatory inspection of our facilities has been successfully completed.As a reminder, DDU-GKY is a skill training and placement program for rural youth, implemented by the Ministry of Rural Development.

Currently, the 9th and 10th batches are undergoing training. Out of 221 trainees who were successfully assessed, an impressive 181 have been placed, reflecting a remarkable placement rate of 82%. We are also pleased to extend support to Vidyaranyam, a Vedic School in Chippalapally, Hyderabad, which is flourishing thanks to generous contributions from philanthropists, both from India and USA. KEATS welcomes support from all who are interested in preserving this noble tradition. A visit to the school will surely be a heartening experience.

Two retail outlets — one on Vijayawada Highway and another at CSD Canteen, Hyderabad — are already operational, alongside several eateries across the region. The efforts of the WEC team, ably led by Mr. YS Subrahmanyam, are truly commendable. We were honored by a visit from celebrated actor and industrialist Sri Muralimohan, who appreciated the empowerment initiatives taken up by KEATS through both SDC and WEC. We warmly invite all KEATS members to visit our centers whenever possible and witness the impact firsthand.
